syilx scholar Dr. Armstrong is a professor in Indigenous Studies and academic coordinator of Interior Salish languages at UBC Okanagan. She is a member of the Royal Society of Canada and an Officer of the Order of Canada, She was born and grew up on the Penticton Indian Reserve. Dr. Armstrong is an award-winning writer, visual artist, researcher, educator, leader and activist. Her research is in Indigenous philosophies and Okanagan syilx thought and environmental ethics coded into syilx oral literatures. She collaborates with Salish speaking groups to re-establish Indigenous languages, historical relationships, and food resource ceremonies through gatherings, trading and protection of water and land practices. As an influential advocate for Indigenous peoples' rights, Dr. Armstrong has been a force of change and widescale community impact through her artistic, research and educational vision.

Bill Cohen is from the Syilx Okanagan Nation with extensive kinship ties throughout BC and Washington. He specializes in the areas of Syilx and Indigenous knowledge, creativity, and transforming pedagogy. He is an educator, artist, and story-teller. The focus of Bill's continuing research is to identify, understand and theorize the transforming potential of Syilx Okanagan kinship pedagogy, where teachers are in aunty-uncle roles with kinship responsibilities to students and tmixw, collectively appreciating difference and diversity, appreciating the gifts from the tmixw (water, earth, plant and animal life forces) and ensuring those gifts continue for the children now and peoples to be.
